Healthy and Unhealthy Characteristics of a Congregation – Part 2

PASTOR'S PEN



Lent is the season of the church year that follows the Epiphany Season. It is a time we set aside each year to remember the love of God that is poured out through Christ Jesus by His death on the cross. His defeat of death, sin and Satan and His resurrection bring eternal life to you.

Why bother with Lent? Because it allows us a form of spiritual practice. Musicians understand that regular practice is necessary. It is a discipline that enables freedom; not a freedom that avoids discipline. Horowitz, the great pianist, said, "If I skip practice one day, I know it. If I skip practice two days, the critics know it. And if I skip practice three days, everybody knows it."

Lent is Christian practice time. It is spring training for the Christian who wants to stay in shape or who wants to get into shape. The means to spiritual health is not a luxury. It is a necessity.

No one is so well-off spiritually that he or she can afford to skip Lent. And no one is so bad-off spiritually that Lent can't be helpful. So Lent, why bother with it? It is practical, it works, it is necessary. *

As we continue in our Lenten journey, we will focus on the beloved hymn *Amazing Grace*. If you will take a few moments, you will surely recall times in your personal life where God's amazing grace made all the difference.

That amazing grace turned Kind David around after he had sinned against the Lord, Bathsheba and her husband Uriah whom David had murdered so he could have Bathsheba for his wife. Psalm 51:3-4, 10-12 (ESV)³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. ⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment... ¹⁰ Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. ¹¹ Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. ¹² Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit.

I look forward with joy and anticipation as we share in our Lenten Journey.



Isn't it wonderful how we gather once a month to worship and fellowship together as a congregation! With that in mind, a Hospitality Team has been created to ensure that the kitchen is well stocked of needed supplies, has easy to follow instructions posted on how to use the appliances, and coordinates cleaning of the kitchen.



We also came up with some guidelines when bringing food into the kitchen that we hope everyone will follow:

- If you place something in the refrigerator, use a provided label to put your name, date and event the food is for
- Unless noted, please do not assume someone will eat leftovers in the refrigerator. All food, except for condiments, will be disposed of within ten days of being placed in the refrigerator.
- Unless otherwise specified, any food in the refrigerator may be used by anyone using the kitchen (i.e., salad dressings, drinks, creamers, etc.)
- A calendar will be placed in the kitchen to log any planned events when the kitchen will be in use
- Please wash and put away any dishes, pots and pans, trays, and utensils after use

ENDOWMENT HIGHLIGHT

The Carolinas Mission District and the NALC Disaster Relief have two disaster relief warehouses that house First Response supplies when disaster strikes. Items such as hygiene kits, school supply kits, blankets, Bibles, and flood bucket kits are housed here. The supplies are available to anyone in the Carolinas Mission District and the NALC,

which Holy Trinity is a part of. Fire, flood, tornado; they all can be deadly and destructive, many times leaving nothing in the aftermath. Endowment funds were approved to assist the NALC Disaster Relief in 2022 and again in 2023. Holy Trinity, along with other sister churches in the NALC help keep these warehouses stocked with items that will be desperately needed when natural disasters strike. The Endowment Grant provides money to help keep supplies stocked and on hand when a need arises. Extending Christ's love and ours and providing for some basic physical needs in a time of tragedy is a part of who we are called to be as Jesus' followers.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT MESSAGE

How did you do in February? Last month, I challenged us all to do better demonstrating our love for the Lord as Jesus commanded us to do by loving God with all of our heart, soul, and might. How did you do? You don't need to tell me or Pastor Tom or anyone else, but I do encourage you to consider that for yourself.



To recap, one way to love God is to spend time reading the Bible each day, so you can hear what God is saying to you and creating the opportunity for you to grow closer to him. You can also demonstrate your love by worshiping him with your church family each week. How did you do? Did you increase the number of days you spent reading scripture? How many Sundays did you worship with your church family?

How else can you demonstrate your love for God? When you are worshiping, are you fully engaged? It is so easy to get distracted. If you are like me, it is easy for your mind to wander. And that doesn't include what happens if your phone gets involved! What can you do to be more engaged? One thing comes straight from Psalm 100: 1-2. "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!" Notice, Psalm 100 says to make a joyful noise. It doesn't say that you must sing well! Just sing! To me, that means the Lord hears your heart instead of your voice. The Lord would love to see and hear more of our congregation singing (even badly!) Lutherans are known for their love of music, so let's show it! When you are singing, you are definitely engaged!

Spending time with God in prayer is another way to demonstrate your love. Are you praying daily telling the Lord what you are thankful for, praising him, and asking for his help? Do you give thanks for each meal before eating - even when you eat out? Witness to those around you that you are thankful to the Lord for your meal and spend time with God.

Let's grow deeper in our relationship with the Lord each day in March!

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS From the February 20, 2023 Regular Meeting

At the February 20 meeting of the Church Council, the following actions were taken:

- Received and approved financial reports from Lee Stadther (see article pg. 12).

- Reviewed offers to purchase the three Garrison Blvd parking lots. Council declined the offer determining not to sell at this time.
- Approved funding to paint the 2^{nd} floor of the main church building.

- Approved Office Administrator job description.
- Approved John Walker to a 2-yr term on the Personnel Committee.
- Approved the request by Cody Carpenter to host the TEC Lock-In on March 25.
- Changed next Council Meeting date to March 27, 2023
- Received reports from the pastor and staff as well as noted dates of upcoming meetings and Council of the Month assignments.
